HOME POISON PREVENTION

- **Most poisonings happen at home & other residences**
- **Children under the age of 5 years old are at the highest risk for accidental poisoning**

| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Carbon monoxide detectors should be installed on the ceiling in hallways near bedrooms & at least 15-20 feet away from heating sources | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Keep purses, totes & backpacks off of the floor where children & pets may be present |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Smoke alarms should be placed in the hallway near bedrooms as well | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> NEVER put medication in diaper bags |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Check smoke alarms & carbon monoxide detectors twice a year and change batteries | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Keep doors closed & locked or use child safety barriers to keep small children out of high risk areas of the home like: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Kitchen• Bathroom• Basement/Laundry room• Garage• Yard |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Over-the-counter & prescription medications can be dangerous with unintended use. Store all medication out of sight & reach of small children and vulnerable adults, preferably in a locked cabinet or box | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Always use child safety locks & latches on cabinet doors where household cleaning products and chemicals are stored |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Keep medicines & household cleaning products in their original, labeled, and child-resistant containers | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Store poisonous products away from food to avoid confusion |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Follow label instructions & warnings on medications and household products | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Do not mix household products & chemicals together |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Marijuana edible & products containing THC should be stored like medication & kept out of reach & sight of children | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Do not provide small children with cleaning or disinfecting products to help clean |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Avoid taking medication or giving medication to others when & where children are present | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Before allowing small children to play in other homes or locations, check for safety hazards |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> When medication are in use, keep open containers within your sight & close immediately after use | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Bring child safety locks/latches for use in other homes & locations |
| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Avoid distractions when taking or administering medication to avoid dosing errors & medication loss | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Use child-resistant caps/packaging correctly, but remember child-resistant does not mean that they are child-proof |
| | <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Keep all medicines, cosmetics & household products up high & out of reach of children & vulnerable adults |
